NOTES FOR CONTRIBUTORS

The Griot - is a referred journal with editors drawn from several parts of the world. It is published by the West African Association for commonwealth Literature and Language Studies WAACLAS, which is a member of African Commonwealth Literature and Language Studies- ACLALS.

The journal draws its essays essentially from conferences of the Association and they are usually themed.

However, as the need arises, special volumes are published outside of the conference papers. All submissions are competitively evaluated in order to select essays that meet the maximum standards of quality set down by the journal.

Authors are advised to pay attention to the following:

- 1. All articles should be set on 1.5 line spacing and at 12 points Times New Roman type face.
- 2. Articles must include Abstracts of not more than 150 words, and should not exceed 18 pages of A4 paper. This include references set in the M.L.A, 7th edition style sheet.
- 3. Only the first page of the article should indicate the name(s) or other personal details of the author(s) e.g institutional address(es), email, telephone numbers(s), etc.
- 4. All graphs, charts and other illustration materials should be drawn on white paper with Indian ink in order to ensure sharp and clean reproduction.
- 5. Manuscript are accepted for publication on the condition that they have not been published or accepted for publication elsewhere. Furthermore, all manuscripts must have been presented first at a conference organized by WAACLALS and re-worked after the conference.
- 6. All submissions should be sent in Microsoft Word or as PDF attachment to the journal email address; <u>Griot.Waaclals@gmailcom</u>.
- 7. All submitted articles must be accompanied by an assessment fee of \$10.00 (Ten Dollars) or payable into the Waaclals account at First Bank of Nigeria, Ekewan Road branch, Account No 2032608096, Account Name: Uniben-Dept of Mass Communication. All assessed and accepted article(s) and author(s) will be notified via text messages and email for the payment of \$100. (One Hundred Dollars) for the publication.

- 8. The Griot-a Waaclals journal is published once a year, except in such circumstances where special volumes are issued. In which case, two volumes may appear in a year.
